Active Participation in the Parish and at Mass

There are many ministries in the parish that assist others either in prayer or in service, also known as "prayer in action." Since there is space in this bulletin, and a need in reality, it might be a good time to announce the opportunities for you to consider service in the parish as lectors, youth altar servers, extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion and ushers. The Church envisions the lay faithful to take an active part in worship, primarily through proper attendance, paying attention, responding, singing, etc., but also through concrete acts of service as in the ministries mentioned above.

Lectors proclaim the word of God during Mass after praying with and reviewing the reading at home prior to the liturgy, youth altar servers assist the priest and the deacon in the celebration of the Mass and extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion bring the Blessed Sacrament to the homebound and assist in its distribution during Mass. Ushers have the role of welcoming parishioners, taking care of problems during the liturgy and collecting the offering during Mass.

Organizational and training sessions are being planned for the various positions of service in the celebration of the Mass, so please consider these ministries and watch for a future notice to learn more about each of the ministries and their requirements.

Today the Church Celebrates The Most Holy Trinity



There is a logical flow to the celebrations throughout the year in the Church. After experiencing the power of Jesus over sin and death in Easter and waiting for the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost last week, it is most appropriate to consider and celebrate the unity of God, The Trinity this Sunday.

The Trinity is one of those doctrines that is classified as a strict mystery; that is, it cannot be learned nor understood completely from reason. The mystery is so great that often words can be difficult to adequately explain and understand this reality of God. It has often been said that whenever anyone begins to explain the Trinity, one falls either into error or heresy. Working hard to avoid both, today's feast day of The Most Holy Trinity celebrates the three divine persons, separate and distinct, in the one and same God.

The first person of the Trinity is God the Father; the second, God the Son; the third, God the Holy Spirit. The three persons are perfectly equal to one another and each is God. There is however only one God and we use the word "person" to explain who someone is, this is why we say that there are three persons in one God; Father, the creator; the Son, the redeemer and the Holy Spirit, the sanctifier.

The Incarnation of God's Son (Jesus, while fully divine taking on human nature) reveals that God is the eternal Father and that the Son is consubstantial with the Father, which means that, in the Father and with the Father, the Son is one and the same God.

The mission of the Holy Spirit, sent by the Father in the name of the Son and by the Son, reveals that, with them, the Spirit is one and the same God. This is seen when we state in the Creed, "With the Father and Son he is adored and glorified."

Inseparable in what they are, the divine persons are also inseparable in what they do. But within the single divine operation each shows forth what is proper to him in the Trinity, especially in the divine missions of the Son's incarnation and the gift of the Holy Spirit.

The majesty of God is awesome and gives us much to ponder and pray over but we must realize that it is only in the glories of heaven that the fullness of God will be made known to us and with that, hopefully a fuller understanding of the Almighty. Happy Trinity Sunday!
