

Epiphany: A Showing, An Appearance, A Revelation...

The solemn celebration of the Epiphany is celebrated in the United States on the Sunday between January 2nd and 8th. This year, Epiphany is celebrated today, January 8th a Sunday before the official end of the Christmas season on the celebration of the Baptism of the Lord, January 9. It is then that we return to Ordinary Time and that is why Christmas decorations are appropriately removed after January 9th.

The Epiphany comes from the Greek "epiphanein" which means a showing, appearance, or revelation. It was used to describe the appearance of a god among the people, a theophany, or a visit from some civil dignitary. The Greek-speaking Church in the east found it natural to use the word to describe the appearance of the true God in flesh.

For us today, the Epiphany celebrates the manifestation to the world of the newborn Christ as Messiah, Son of God, and Savior of the world. Within the one feast we celebrate the adoration of Jesus by the wise men (magi) from the East, together with his baptism in the Jordan and the wedding feast of Cana in Galilee. These three events are recalled as the Son of God is revealed to the world.

There is a wonderful video called "The Star of Bethlehem" that scientifically unlocks the mystery of the world's most famous star. Producer Stephen McEveety (The Passion of the Christ) presents an amazing documentary on the Star of Bethlehem. The presentation explores the exciting truth of Scripture and reveals the evidence for God's existence as seen in the stars above. The presenter, Rick Larson walks the viewer through biblical and historical clues revealing the incredible significance of the celestial event as well as the vastness of God's creativity. This video can be borrowed from Fr. Morgewicz or accessed online.

A popular tradition since the Middle Ages performed on the Epiphany is the blessing of homes with holy water. The ritual calls for a priest or parent to mark with chalk the inside of the main door with the initials of the Magi and a code of the current year connected with crosses: 20+C+M+B+23. Another explanation of the initials (C,M,B) is that they stand for the first letters of the blessing: Christus mansionem benedicat ("May Christ bless this house"). What a wonderful tradition to begin in your own family for the parent of the house to take holy water (available from the Church in the Holy Water font) and preform the ritual. God Bless and may the manifestation of Christ, as honored on the Epiphany be demonstrated by you to the world each and every day of your life.

Mass Cancelation Policy During Inclement Weather

Daily Mass at 9:00 a.m. is canceled whenever the Newington Public School System closes for inclement weather. Sunday Masses (Saturday Vigil and Sunday Morning Masses) are canceled whenever the Governor declares a travel ban, prohibiting or restricting the use of vehicles on the road.

This policy will eliminate the need to call the rectory to ask if there is Mass and serve as an easy way to announce our closing. Mass intentions will be satisfied by the priest celebrant at his private Mass in the event that a scheduled public Mass is canceled.

This policy is in place for a number of reasons. First is the fact that God has given each of us common sense and the gift of prudence, which should be employed at times of questionable weather. The second reason is the potential liability to the parish and third, adequate time is needed to clear and clean up after a snowfall. Cleanup, either shoveling or plowing is made more difficult if there are cars in the way or if cars and foot traffic pack down the snow onto the parking lot surface.
