Recent Homily – Monsignor Kinnane

We often mix up “**Freedom of Choice**” with “**Right**”. I am “**free**” to do many things I have no right to. Even Jesus gives us the freedom to reject Him and His teachings.

I’m free to get a gun and hold up the 7-11 but I have no “right” because it belongs to someone else. So, if the owner grabs a gun, beats me up and calls the cops, and now I’m bleeding, sore and on my way to jail—I had freely brought all that on myself. When we decide to do something freely, we also take on freely, responsibility for whatever unpleasant consequences may result.

Now, this issue of the difference of freedom from right causes a lot of confusion with “abortion”. First, all humans, men and women, have the right and freedom to determine the physical care of their own bodies. This is not the issue the issue is a lot deeper. The key question to face is: is the act of abortion a violent ending of an innocent, defenseless human life? If so, no other human has the right to do that. If it is done, it is done freely, but not by any right. An injustice is being inflicted on another human, just as an injustice was freely being done on the poor 7-11 clerk. My personal freedom is no longer a purely private matter. Have you ever seen an abortion? I have -- and many who have, agree that it comes across clearly as an act not in accord with the teaching of Jesus. Our Church teaching is really only reminding us of something we already know way down deep.

Now, the **free choice** is ours. **Freedom** is frightening, isn’t it?

It means we have to live with and accept **all** its consequences.
